Assists the Parks Department and Engineering Department with the implementation of the Cameron County Dune Protection and Beach Access Plan and Erosion Response Plan Assist the Parks Department and Engineering Department with the review of dune protection applications for adequacy and compliance with the approved plan. Provides staff support to the Cameron County Dune Protection Committee Recommend and implements sound scientific and ecological principles necessary for shoreline management and coastal erosion restoration. Works on community-based projects such as dune restoration, beach cleanups, and educational outreach. Conduct annual beach monitoring program and report preparation for USACE in consultation with USFW. Reports to Staff Engineer. Shall be able to perform other duties as assigned. This is not a Civil Service Covered position.
