**Cameron County Precinct 2 Public Works Building**

On October, 17, 2017, Cameron County Commissioners' Court approved a contract award to Peacock General Contractors for the new Precinct 2 Public Works Building. This new construction will relocate the current offices in downtown Brownsville to a more strategically located area in North Brownsville. Precinct 1 and Precinct 2 are currently co-located and do not have the sufficient building space and area to efficiently run their respective public work's departments. These improved facilities will better serve the taxpayers and the community as a whole.

The building will be built on a 19 acre tract of land. The building will be 9,000 square feet in size and is divided into two major functions: an administrative area with a lobby for visitors, staff offices, meeting conference room/staff lounge and mechanical areas, while the second area is the crew vehicle storage bays which utilize some enclosed storage to protect heavy equipment, and some open air covered areas, along with a crew vehicle wash bay.

The site also includes a large parking area for visitors and employees. It has a large area for public works stock materials with plenty of room for expansion.

Both buildings utilize a steel structure with metal stud and CMU walls that are clad with grey and blue horizontal and vertical metal panels. Exposed steel beams at crew vehicle bays will be galvanized and will have metal panel soffits to finish off the underside of the metal roof structure. The project total cost is \$1.3 million dollars and construction will last approximately 300 days.
